Hancock Street Mural Painting

Our street mural has worn and faded over the past couple years, and it's time to re-paint! **We** will gather on Sunday, September 15th to paint and re-beautify this block of the Hollywood neighborhood! *The* event will run from 10am to 4pm.

In 2016, over 100 volunteers came out to paint the **Hollywood Garden Mural** on NE Hancock Street between 44th and 45th – the block adjacent to RCPPC, and which hosts the Hollywood Farmers Market each Saturday. Taking its inspiration from the bountiful produce on display at the farmers market, the mural takes the form of a garden, with a path of stepping stones winding its way around fruits, vegetables and vines. This is one of the largest street paintings in Portland, stretching curb–to–curb along 100 feet of Hancock Street. On market day, it serves as a beautiful carpet for the farmers market, and throughout the week it leaves a reminder of the market on the street. We hope you'll join us for this festive event.
